#### The President's Message

#### **Potting Mixes**

#### ORCHID MEDIA RECEIPE

To make up the media that we use at the RBG, is as follows 3 parts bark, 1 part course perlite, 1 part charcoal [soaked in hot water for about an hour] and add 1 part sphagnum moss damp, fluffed up. Take a container of any size and use this as your one part measure. After mixing all the parts together drain access water and start potting. DO NOT mix media dry and use it dry for potting. You need to soak the media so that it will accept watering, otherwise water will only run through the pot not provide the water to the plants.

This is the basis of the mix. If you find that you need more dampness in the mix because you do not water enough then add more moss, if you decide you need more aeration then add more perlite. Always mix according you to your needs. Everyone grows differently!

Phragmipedium Mix for semi-hydroponic potting by Pat Vuurman \*\*\*

1 part fine baked clay bits (Turface \* is the trade name) 2 parts medium charcoal

3 parts medium perlite

15 to 20 parts medium coir \*\* for small to medium sized plants

or

5 parts medium plus 10 to 15 parts large coir \*\* for larger plants

- \* Turface is available at hydroponics stores.
- \*\* Some coir, claiming "rinsed" on the packaging, still contains copious quantities of salts. Phrags cannot tolerate built up salts. Coir MUST be soaked and rinsed several times (thrice is recommended) using BOILING water to remove excess salts.
- \*\*\* This recipe is successful in our growing conditions. Please try it on one or two Phrags first before committing an entire collection to a major change.

#### Paphiopedilum Potting Mix by Pat Vuurman \*\*

1 part fine baked clay bits (Turface \* is the trade name)

- 2 parts medium charcoal
- 2 parts medium perlite

15 to 20 parts medium bark for small to medium sized plants

5 parts medium plus 10 to 15 parts large bark for larger plants

- \* Turface is available at hydroponics stores.
- \*\* This recipe is successful in our growing conditions. Please try it on one or two Paphs first before committing an entire collection to a major change.

Greenhouse Volunteers Needed

As you may know, the Orchid Society maintains the collection of orchids in the RBG greenhouse. This is a significant commitment which cannot be carried out without the help of volunteers.

Currently a group of volunteers meets on Thursday mornings from 9:30 to noon, more or less, and another group meets on Sunday mornings from about 10 until 12:30. This schedule is dictated by watering requirements. Volunteers are currently being sought for both these teams. "On the job" training is provided if needed.

In addition to watering, volunteers look after repotting the orchids, cleaning any plants that are being attacked by pests, removing dead leaves, sterilizing pots and other equipment, preparing plants for display and many other small but important tasks.

Volunteers are not required to attend every week, but some commitment to the collection should be demonstrated.
